MISSION PROGRAMS

Life Recovery for Men

The men's program uses a Christ-centered approach to helping men 18 and over resolve addiction and other life issues. In the program, a man will receive Christian counseling, learn how to heal from past wounds and develop healthy ways of coping. He will also get the chance to study the Bible and participate in the education program to improve employment skills or obtain a GED. After graduating, men have the opportunity to move into transitional housing until they are able to get back on their feet.

Shelter for Men

The men's shelter provides food, clothing and shelter to every man who enters our doors. Whether he eats one meal, stays one night, enjoys the Mission's hospitality for months or, decides to enter the life-recovery program, our staff and volunteers will be there to serve his needs.













Life Recovery for Women

Women who are homeless, abused or chemically dependent, can find refuge, safety and healing at the Nashville Rescue Mission. During her stay, a woman will receive Christian counseling and learn how to heal from past wounds. She will also have an opportunity to study the Bible and participate in the education program in order to improve employment skills or obtain a GED. Mothers are also taught good parenting techniques. After graduating, women have the opportunity to move into transitional housing until they are able to get back on their feet.

Shelter for Women

The Nashville Rescue Mission provides Christian support and guidance to homeless women and children. These guests receive food, clothing and shelter. The Mission provides them with life's basic necessities,

including chapel services and daily devotions, overnight lodging, bathing facilities, clothing distribution and Christian counseling. These women also have the opportunity to enter the Mission's life-recovery program.

Education

Many of those who enter the Mission's liferecovery program struggle with reading, writing, math and other life skills. Through the education program, clients are taught basic arithmetic and literacy, while others prepare for the GED exam. All are taught job preparedness, resume writing and interviewing skills. Women are offered classes on parenting, grief and loss. In addition, classes in computer software, finances and commercial driving are offered to all. Through the advancement of education, clients come to see that greater personal wholeness and freedom is achieved through education.













Volunteering

Lifting a hurting person out of homelessness takes teamwork—many people working together to meet both physical and relational needs over the long haul. At the Nashville Rescue Mission, we partner with thousands of volunteers each year to touch lives for today and for eternity.
